

"If only Oldsmobile had made a Toronado convertible"

The Mike Connors detective show "Mannix," included a pair of custom cars for the title character. While Joe Mannix drove a series of stock FoMoCo products through the first few episodes of the first season, show producers decided partway through the season to ask George Barris to come up with a flashier car. After choosing a 1967 Oldsmobile Toronado (perhaps inspired by Barris's previous experience building the 70-X Toronados for Esso for Expo 67), Barris cut off the roof and installed a semi-permanent tonneau cover behind the front seats, thus converting the coupe into a two-seat roadster (the top apparently did go up, as seen in one episode, but remained down for pretty much the entire run of the car on the show). A more prominent grille, full-time exposed headlamps, and hood reshaping redefined the front end while a subtle spoiler lip and full-width red translucent tail lamp cover added some flair to the rear. While the 425-cu.in. V-8 and front-wheeldrive package remained stock, Barris did add side pipes and fake knockoffs. In initial appearances of the Toronado on the show, it featured sealed-beam headlamps in oval surrounds and silver over black paint, but Barris would later refresh the car with European-style oval headlamps and silver over red paint. Barris also added ventilated heated seats to the interior at that time. A second Toronado, was used for stunt work. received similar modifications.

#### R.E. Olds museum offered chance to buy its building from Lansing for \$2.



Lansing Mayor Virg Bernero has agreed to sell the building to the museum for \$2. The sale is currently pending approval from the city council as well as a 30-day public comment period. Since its creation in 1979, the museum has leased — for \$1 per year — the 25,000-square-foot building on the Grand River from the city. What once served as a municipal bus garage and later fell into a state of "complete disrepair" has since been turned into a space that not only exhibits Oldsmobile and REO vehicles but also celebrates the contributions Ransom Eli Olds has made to the city of Lansing.

Schwartzly, the manager of the museum, noted that the museum has responsibility for the building's maintenance and upkeep — as stipulated in a 2005 amendment to the lease agreement — and doesn't rely on the city to pay any of its bills. Yet because the museum does not own the building, it often misses out on donations or grants from individuals and entities that would like to be reassured of the museum's permanence. "We know the city will never kick us out, of course," she said. Yet the city administration has also in recent years adopted a policy of granting only short-term leases to nonprofits.

According to the museum's most recent available 990 form from 2015, contributions and grants made up the largest single portion of the museum's annual revenue: \$76,417 out of \$160,642, or about 48 percent. The museum's total revenue, however, fell short of its total expenses two of the last three years.

Priority number one, according to Schwartzly, is to address the roof, which the museum last repaired in 1992 and which a grant from the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs is expected to fund. The museum also needs to upgrade its bathrooms to make them compliant with the Americans for Disabilities Act and museum officials would eventually like to set aside some garage space to teach teens how to work on older cars. As noted on the museum's website, the museum has already undergone an appraisal, site survey, and environmental assessment in preparation for a handoff from the city. That appraisal came in at \$140,000, but estimates for roof repairs have come in at \$167,000, according to the *Lansing State Journal*.

While some in the city have suggested the building be sold to a developer rather than to a tax-exempt non-profit organization, Schwartzly said it's doubtful any developer would want to buy a building in a floodway, and besides, it's not as though the city would be losing a source of tax revenue by selling the building to the museum.

"It's time for the city to give back to the museum," she said.
