

“BETWEEN THE BUMPERS” ... By Ed Konsmo



OCA Election News! 2010 is an election year for the Oldsmobile Club of America and there will be some changes and new faces on the OCA Board of Directors. There are several Zone Directors who have chosen not to run for re-election with as many as four candidates running for the two positions in one zone. That is not the case in our Pacific Northwest Zone. Ken Pilidis, who has been representing our zone since Sherry Soball passed away, has chosen not to remain on the Board. Jamie Cox, from North Saanich, B.C., has accepted the nomination to take Ken's position. Jamie is a member of the PSOC and also very active in car clubs in B.C. and will be a great representative from Western Canada.

The offices of OCA President, Vice President and Treasurer will have challengers to their positions. In the April issue of the JWO all of the candidates for the offices will be featured with their bios. In this column in coming months I will provide information regarding these offices and why I believe that your support and vote for the incumbents is very important.

On February 27, I attended a Judging Clinic put on by the Classic Car Club of America sponsored by the LeMay Museum at Club Auto in Kirkland. Having never been exposed to the judging criteria of the CCCA, it was a very interesting experience. They have a very different outlook in several areas of judging a vehicle compared to the OCA's format or several other National Car Clubs. For example, their philosophy toward how the condition of a car might be on the show field with respect to dust and dirt was interesting. They do not take off points for dirty wheels or undercarriage if the car was driven a number of miles to the show. Their belief is that the car was spotless when it left its home and along the way picked up the road dust. If the owner did not have time to re-detail the car completely, that's okay. However, if the car looks like it had never been detailed, then the deductions are deserved.

The CCCA does believe that the un-restored cars should be judged for their authenticity and not for points just like the OCA adopted two years ago. They agree that a car is original only once and if you paint or re-upholster part of the car, it is no longer un-restored.

The most significant point that I came away from this clinic was how the Classic Car Club of America relies on the expertise of its members with respect to knowledge of specific models of the cars that are being judged. During the course of this clinic I was assigned to the team that judged a 1930 Duesenberg. What a magnificent car it is. On the team were two owners of Duesenbergs that really knew what should be correct and what was not. There was only one item on this car that was incorrect, a voltage regulator that was polished instead of black. Without an expert present, this is an item that the average judge would not know.

That brings up the subject of the Judging Clinic that your editor will be heading at the Nationals in Sturbridge this year. Based on several judging controversies in recent years, it has become apparent that the more informed a team of judges can be, the better the judging process will be. It is the hope of the OCA Judging Committee that the clinic will broaden the knowledge of its judges and make the process of judging more efficient and enjoyable.

Remember most of all; enjoy the Olds that you own on the open road.

LeMay Museum Update

The Puget Sound Olds Club members voted at the January 3rd meeting to become a part of the LeMay Museum. Each month we will bring you information regarding the progress of the Museum.

Museum Contractor Chosen

At the Bonhams & Butterfields auction last summer, David Maderia, LeMay Museum President and CEO, announced that JTM Construction will be the general contractor for the Museum. Among the buildings in the Pacific Northwest that JTM is responsible for constructing are the Museum of Glass in Tacoma, Benaroya Hall in Seattle, Marion McCaw Hall in Seattle and the Frye Art Museum.

Additional projects in progress are the major renovation of the office and technology campus in Puyallup and a new three-story city hall for the City of Poulsbo. The JTM Construction Company recently won the Best of Northwest Construction 2009 Industrial Projects award for the construction of a utility and power plant in Tacoma.

It would appear that the world class museum that has been envisioned by the LeMay family for Tacoma will have the one of the finest companies to make it a reality.

LeMay and City of Tacoma Conclude Deal for Land Transfer

A Major Milestone toward Groundbreaking

In a unanimous vote Tuesday, February 9, the Tacoma City Council approved the final agreement between the LeMay Museum and the City. President & CEO, David Madeira commented that "it's a complex agreement that took a lot of effort for both parties to coordinate. We are very grateful for the City's efforts and their staff's cooperation," said Madeira.

With the land transfer approved, the LeMay Museum is now able to focus on securing the final financing for the project and move forward to a much-anticipated ground breaking targeted for this spring.


DIRECTIONS TO THE MERCER ISLAND LIBRARY FOR THE CHAPTER MEETING - MARCH 7, 2010
